Verna Grahek Mize Inducted into Michigan Women's Hall of Fame Houghton native Verna Grahek Mize (1913-2013) was honored for her "Save Lake Superior" campaign, begun in 1967 to end the dumping of asbestos-like iron mining waste into Lake Superior. Her lobbying of government officials for six years inspired others to action that led to

the landmark United States of America v. Reserve Mining Company case. As a result, USEPA gained broader powers to regulate corporate pollution, and dumping of mining waste into Lake Superior ended in 1980.
